1. **Edward "Adie or A.D." Wallick** – Born July 16, 1852 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died February 28, 1901 in York County, PA (per tombstone) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA
2. **Rebecca Jane Gable** – Born November 16, 1854 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died February 4, 1925 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA.
3. **Lillie May Wallick** – Born April 26, 1876 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died February 17, 1940 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Home Cemetery in Dallastown, York County, PA. She married **Charles Fix** who was born March 2, 1874 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died January 9, 1939 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Home Cemetery in Dallastown, York County, PA

Location of residence

- According to the book titled *Red Lion: The First One Hundred Years*, Edward's home in 1880 was located at what later became 10 N Main St, just north of his father's home on the square. When Nathaniel Neiman bought the property, the home was moved to what is now 77 E. High St. To corroborate this location for where Edward lived, there is a sheriff's deed (Deed Book 2-052) in 1887 where Edward had property that was bought by his father that was bounded by property owned by Henry Wallick on the south, Benjamin F. Zarfos on the north, an alley on the west and N. Main St. on the east. Also, the 1885 Road Docket for the widening of N. Main St. shows Edward Wallick owning property just north of his father Henry. Edward's home was located on what is now the parking lot along N. Main St. beside the old First National Bank building.

Occupation and Civic Involvement in Red Lion

- Edward Wallick was elected as Auditor for a one year term during the first election in Red Lion in 1880.
- Edward worked as a farm laborer, stage coach operator, bartender and hostler according to census records and city directories.
- After Edward's death, Rebecca lived in town at several places in Red Lion and worked as a tobacco stripper.

- Ellen and her husband Calvin Smith lived at what is now 20 S. Pine St. Ellen worked as a cigar maker.

Miscellaneous Notes

- Edward was known as “Adie” or A.D., documents rarely show him as going by the name Edward.
- Lillie and her husband Charles Fix moved to Dallastown.
