1. **Charles Innerst** – Born September 27, 1854 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died February 16, 1923 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA
2. **Mary Wallick** – Born July 6, 1859 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died May 23, 1931 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA.

Location of residence

- Based on the route that was taken by the census worker and the households visited before and after the Innerst household (the census taker visited the Neiman household on S. Main St. and then the households of Henry Wallick and Edward Wallick near the square before visiting Charles Innerst), they probably lived somewhere in the vicinity of the intersection of Main St & Broadway. A possibility is they resided at what was 77 W Broadway (which later became 127 W Broadway before being demolished for part of the parking lot of the United Brethren Church). Charles did purchase that property from his father-in-law Henry Wallick in 1882, making it possible him and his wife resided there also in 1880.

Occupation and Civic Involvement in Red Lion

- Charles worked as a carpenter and tobacco stripper, Mary also worked as a tobacco stripper
- Charles and Mary lived at what became 127 W. Broadway, the home is no longer standing and the land is now used as a parking lot for Bethany United Methodist Church.
