1. **James Smith** – Born July 29, 1857 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died October 30, 1881 in York County, PA (per tombstone) and buried at Freysville Cemetery in Windsor Twp, York County, PA
2. **Clara Jane Haines** – Born either October 13, 1858 in York County, PA (per death certificate) or October 16, 1857 (per tombstone), died June 22, 1926 in Dauphin County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Windsor Cemetery in Windsor Twp, York County, PA
3. **Charles Smith** – Born November 1875 (per 1900 census). Unknown date of death
4. **Emanuel Haines** – Born September 25, 1855 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died February 8, 1924 (per tombstone) and buried at Windsor Cemetery in Windsor Twp, York County, PA. He married **Mary Morris** who was born February 4, 1866 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died December 3, 1947 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Prospect Hill Cemetery in Manchester Twp, York County, PA
5. **Benjamin Ambrose Haines** – Born March 4, 1860 in York County, PA (per social security records) and died July 6, 1946 in New Castle County, DE (per obituary). He first married **Rebecca Wallick** who was born January 11, 1861 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died November 15, 1884 in York County, PA (per tombstone) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA. He then married **Mary Wilhelm**

Location of residence

- Based on the households visited before and after the James Smith household in the census, the family probably was living in the vicinity of the intersection of N. Main St. and First Avenue. The households visited before his lived south of the intersection of N. Main St. and First Avenue, while the households visited afterward lived north of that intersection.

Occupation and Civic Involvement in Red Lion

- James worked as a cigar maker according to the 1880 census.
- In 1880, James was elected as a councilman in the borough's first elections.
- Emanuel worked as a cigar maker according to the 1880 census and 1881 city directory.
- Benjamin worked as a cigar maker according to the 1880 census

Miscellaneous Notes

- Emanuel left Red Lion sometime between 1881 when he is listed in the city directory and 1890 when he is listed as living in Harrisburg according to their city directory.
- Benjamin's first wife Rebecca was also an original Red Lion resident and daughter of Henry Wallick. By 1888, he is listed in the city directory for Wilmington, DE where he would reside for the remainder of his life.
- Clara was the sister of Emanuel and Benjamin. In 1902, Clara re-married Eli Marks and resided at 44 First Avenue.
