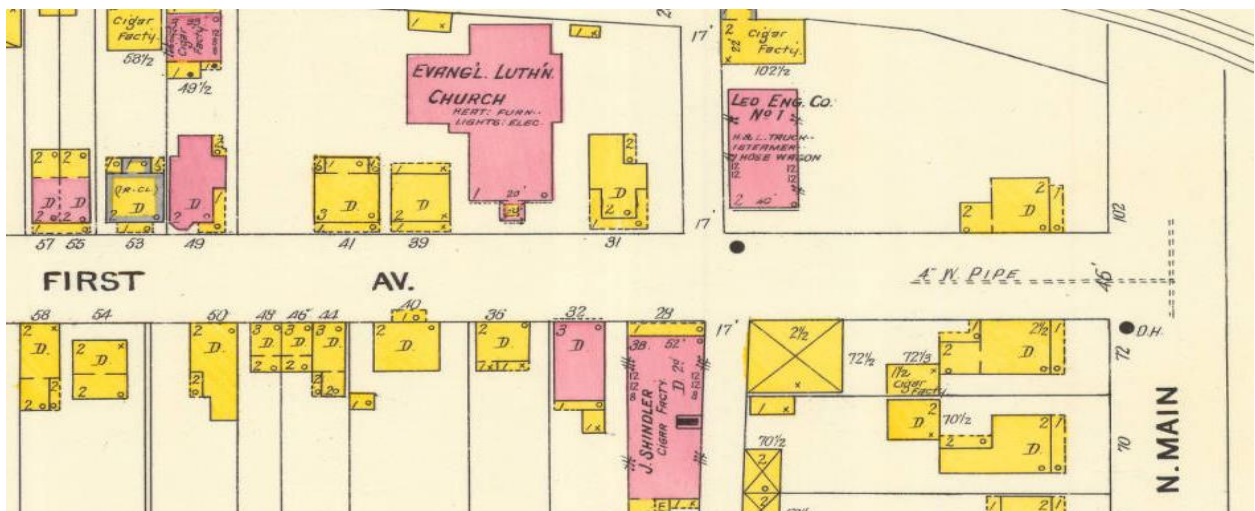

Individual Information

1. **Jacob Miller** – Born February 16, 1810 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died November 15, 1894 in York County, PA (per tombstone) and buried at Freysville Cemetery in Windsor Twp, York County, PA
2. **Reverend Edward Garver “E. G.” Williams** – Born August 21, 1848 in Philadelphia, PA (per death certificate), died August 22, 1920 in Columbus County, NC (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA
3. **Mary Ellen Miller** – Born August 28, 1853 in York County, PA (per family bible), died October 1, 1940 in Seneca County, OH (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA
4. **Jennie Williams** – Born July 14, 1879 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died July 19, 1931 in Laurens County, SC (per death certificate) and buried at Laurens City Cemetery in Laurens County, SC. She married **Isaac Jones** who was born September 23, 1868 in OH (per tombstone), died July 8, 1940 in Clarke County, GA (per death certificate) and buried at Laurens City Cemetery in Laurens County, SC

Location of residence

- Home is located at the northwest corner of First Avenue and N. Main St., at what is now 62 N. Main St (address listed as 102 on 1908 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map below).



Occupation and Civic Involvement in Red Lion

- In the 1880 census, Jacob is listed as a Gentleman (retired).
- Jacob was elected as the first Judge in Red Lion in the 1880 election
- Reverend E. G. Williams was the first pastor of St. John's Reformed church in Red Lion and served in that capacity from 1879 through the spring of 1882
- Reverend Williams was elected as one of the first directors on the school board in 1881.

Miscellaneous Notes

- Reverend E.G. Williams and his family left Red Lion and moved to Marion County, OH before he moved to Rowan County, NC
- Census lists Reverend E.G. Williams as head of household, however the property was owned by Jacob Miller and was his residence from 1877 until his death in 1894.
