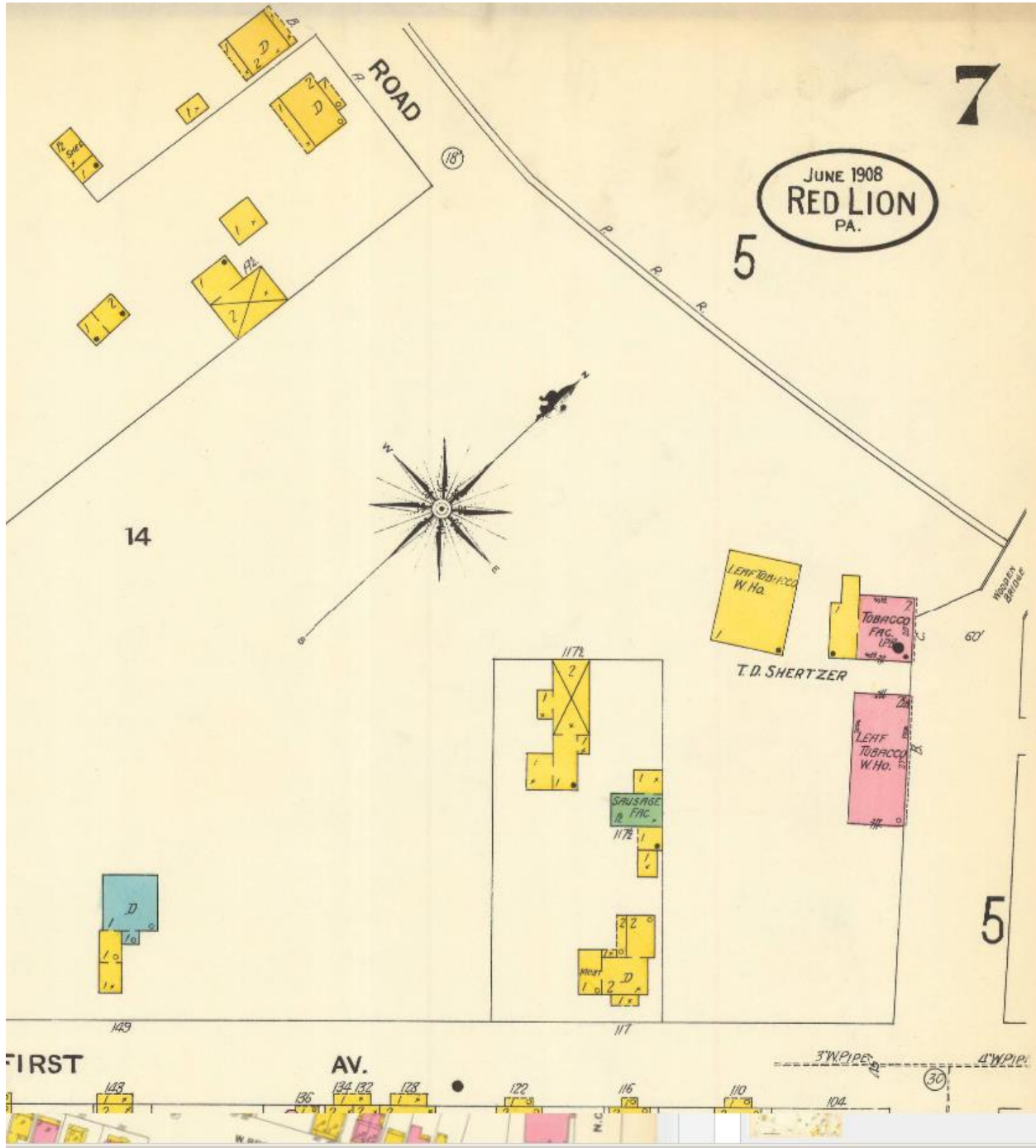
Individual Information

1. **Andrew Keener** – Born July 6, 1836 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died October 9, 1907 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA.
2. **Elizabeth Shoff** – Born July 20, 1835 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died June 30, 1923 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA.
3. **Christian Keener** – Born November 30, 1862 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died October 29, 1948 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA. He married **Mary Ellen Shearer** who was born March 17, 1863 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died March 1, 1935 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA.
4. **Jacob Keener** – Born February 28, 1868 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died October 8, 1948 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA. He married **Ida Runkle** who was born December 4, 1869 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died February 8, 1922 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA.
5. **Alice Keener** – Born February 28, 1868 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died March 10, 1895 in York County, PA (per tombstone) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA.
6. **Pius Keener** – Born July 10, 1870 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died February 10, 1924 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA. He married **Matilda Smeltzer** who was born November 23, 1885 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died September 1, 1953 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA.
7. **Laura Keener** - Born June 15, 1873 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died November 8, 1959 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Freysville Cemetery in Windsor

Twp, York County, PA. She married **Aaron Eisensmith** who was born March 31, 1874 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died May 19, 1934 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Freysville Cemetery in Windsor Twp, York County, PA.

Location of residence

- Andrew Keener's residence was along what is now Railroad Avenue. Below is the 1908 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map of Red Lion which shows the home of Andrew Keener (2nd house from the upper-left hand corner and below the word "Road") across from the Railroad tracks. It is now numbered as 20-22 Railroad Ave.



Occupation and Civic Involvement in Red Lion

- Andrew is listed as working for the Railroad in the 1880 census, city directories from 1881 to 1898 list his occupation as a cigar maker and the 1900 census and 1904 city directory list him as a farmer.
- After Andrew's death, Elizabeth moved to 136 W High St.
- Christian is listed as a cigar maker in the 1880 census, and in subsequent census and city directories he is listed as either a farmer or cigar maker. He originally lived along Railroad Avenue near his father, probably at 16 Railroad Ave, before moving to 181 First Avenue in the mid-1920's.
- Jacob is listed as a farm helper in the 1880 census, and in later census and city directories he is listed as a stone mason, cigar maker, working as a laborer in a furniture factory and as a driver. Jacob resided at what is now listed as 14 Railroad Ave.
- Pius worked as a laborer and lived on West High St in town before moving back to Railroad Avenue in the early 1920's, shortly before his death.
- Laura and her husband Aaron Eisensmith lived in Dallastown before moving back to Red Lion in the mid 1910's. They lived at what is now 130 N Franklin St. Laura worked as a cigar maker.
