1. **Nathaniel Neiman** – Born March 18, 1850 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died December 18, 1928 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA
2. **Henrietta Herrman** – Born March 12, 1851 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died November 13, 1930 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA.
3. **Dora Neiman** – Born July 15, 1871 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died September 30, 1934 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA. She married **Harry Craley** who was born either January 11, 1865 in York County, PA (per tombstone) or January 11, 1866 (per death certificate), died September 16, 1923 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA
4. **Charles Edward Mate** – Born May 26, 1866 PA (per death certificate), died December 3, 1930 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA. He married **Emma Eliza Schlog** who was born December 21, 1867 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died August 5, 1931 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA

Location of residence

- Beach Nichols 1876 Atlas of York County shows N. Neiman living to the west of S. Main St. and to the south of W. Broadway. According to the book, *Red Lion: The First One Hundred Years*, the home is still in existence today and is located at 42 S. Main St.



Occupation and Civic Involvement in Red Lion

- Nathaniel was elected as one of Red Lion's first councilmen in 1880 and in 1884 he was elected as a school director.
- Nathaniel was appointed as Postmaster of the Red Lion Post Office from 1888-1892. His daughter Dora worked in the Post Office as a clerk.
- Nathaniel and his wife Henrietta began the first cigar factory in what would later become Red Lion borough in the 1873-1874 timeframe.
- In 1886, Nathaniel and his wife built a home along the east side of North Main St in which he conducted a store known as the Neiman Store. The current address of this location is 13-17 N Main St. After 14 years of operating the business and living at this location, he retired from the general store business and in 1901 he built a home at what became 10 N Main St. That home was located right beside the Red Lion First National Bank building that was on the square. Unfortunately, that home no longer exists.
- Nathaniel served on the original Board of Directors for the Red Lion Water Company when it was formed and sold one acre of his land for the use of the water company for \$1.
- Nathaniel's house served as the office of the Red Lion Electric Company and he also served on the Board of Directors
- Charles Mate and his wife first lived on First Avenue before eventually moving in with Dr. Hyson by 1904 and residing with him until they passed away. According to census records and city directories, Charles worked as a cigar maker, plumber and farm laborer among other occupations.


