
Individual Information

1. **Henry Wallick** – Born April 21, 1832 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died November 15, 1897 in York County, PA (per tombstone) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA
2. **Ruth Bell** – Born September 16, 1837 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died March 6, 1906 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA.
3. **Rebecca Wallick** – Born January 11, 1861 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died November 15, 1884 in York County, PA (per tombstone) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA. She married **Benjamin Ambrose Haines** who was born March 4, 1860 in York County, PA (per social security records) and died July 6, 1946 in New Castle County, DE (per obituary)
4. **Lydia Wallick** – Born October 3, 1862 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died February 25, 1941 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Windsor Cemetery in Windsor Twp, York County, PA. She married **Samuel Smith** who was born August 30, 1861 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died February 10, 1929 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Windsor Cemetery in Windsor Twp, York County, PA
5. **Cassandra Wallick** – Born March 24, 1864 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died July 9, 1933 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA. She married **Charles Edward Biles** who was born July 28, 1855 in MD (per death certificate), died February 14, 1922 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA
6. **Ellen Wallick** – Born October 12, 1866 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died March 5, 1941 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA. She married **Calvin Smith** who was born December 9, 1853 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died June 11, 1934 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA

7. **William Wallick** – Born November 12, 1868 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died January 15, 1891 in York County, PA (per tombstone) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA.

Location of residence

- The 1908 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map of Red Lion shows the home of Henry Wallick at the corner of N. Main St. and W. Broadway (home in bottom-right section of map). The book titled, *Red Lion: The First One Hundred Years* states the location of Henry Wallick's residence was on the square and was torn down to make room for the First National Bank of Red Lion.

Occupation and Civic Involvement in Red Lion

- Henry Wallick was elected as one of the two first Justices of the Peace in Red Lion in 1880 (along with Seth Minnich).
- Henry owned and operated what was previously known as Caslow's Inn, which was located on the southeast corner of Broadway and Main St. In 1886, he built the Wallick Inn on the southwest corner of Broadway and Main St.
- Cassandra and her husband Charles Edward Biles lived first at what is now 223-225 W. Broadway and then moved to what is now 221 N Main St. Cassandra worked as a tobacco stripper.
- Ellen and her husband Calvin Smith lived at what is now 20 S. Pine St. Ellen worked as a cigar maker.

Miscellaneous Notes

- Rebecca's husband Benjamin Haines was also an original resident of Red Lion, it is unknown if they resided in Red Lion before she passed away in 1884.
- Lydia and her husband Samuel Smith lived in Windsor Twp and have no known contributions to Red Lion
- It is unknown if William lived anywhere else in Red Lion besides his parents' home when he passed away in 1891
