- Elizabeth Eveler was presumably the second wife of Ferdinand. Ferdinand's first wife Christiana died in 1877.
- Elizabeth and her 2 sons Abraham and John are also listed in 1880 as living in Chanceford Twp with Elizabeth's mother Magdalena Eveler. She is listed as a widow.
- John moved to Mifflin County
