

### Location of residence

• George owned the properties that are now located at 12 N. Main St. and 16 N. Main St., with his house likely being originally located at 12 N. Main St. This is based on Sheriff's deed 1-228 that was recorded in 1880 that shows George's land was bounded by Edward Wallick, Henry Wallick, Matthew Gable and Baltimore Rd. Edward Wallick's property was located at 10 N. Main St. (now the parking lot behind what became the First National Bank of Red Lion), Henry also owned property to the west of the homes along N Main St., Matthew Gable owned land along N Main St. at what is now 20 N. Main St. and Baltimore Road was later renamed N. Main St. This property was bought by Jacob Beitzel in 1880 who then sold half of it to Benjamin F. Zarfos on August 24, 1881 (the property at what is now 12 N. Main St.). This is also confirmed by the 1885 Road Docket for the widening of N. Main St. which shows two adjoining properties, one owned by Benjamin Zarfos and the other by B. F. Zarfos being bordered by Edward Wallick and Emanuel Smith (who then owned the original land of Matthew Gable). Based on the map in the 1885 Road Docket, the two Zarfos properties would have been the original property of George Knaub.
