

- Samuel Sprenkle Born April 22, 1839 in PA (per death certificate), died either May 2, 1910 (per tombstone) or May 3, 1910 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA
- 2. Fannie Brenneman Born May 7, 1842 in PA (per death certificate), died April 24, 1931 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA
- 3. Annie Sprenkle Born February 24, 1862 in PA (per death certificate), died January 19, 1940 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA. She married **George Gohn** who was born December 2, 1858 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died September 16, 1940 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA

Location of residence

• Based on the path the census taker took, Samuel and his family were living along N. Main St. This corresponds with information found in the book titled Red Lion: The First One Hundred Years, which states that Samuel owned the brick 3 story building at what is now 41-45 N Main St. (listed as 59-63 below) and that it was built in 1876. A newspaper article from the York Gazette in the 1880's also mentioned that Samuel Sprenkle owned a brick building along N. Main St. and south of the railroad tracks. Finally, the 1885 Road Docket for the widening of N. Main St. shows Samuel owning property on the east side of N. Main St. that contains the brick building. Originally in 1876, only 41 N. Main St was built, the additional sections of the building were added later.

Occupation and Civic Involvement in Red Lion

- Samuel worked as a carpenter according to the 1880 census, various city directories later showed he was a phosphates and coal dealer, had a lumber yard and saw mill and lastly as a farmer. Samuel and Fannie lived most of their lives at what is now 258 East Broadway, although based on the route the census taker took in 1880 and the 1885 Road Docket for the widening of N. Main St., it appears they lived along N. Main St. in 1880.
- Annie and her husband lived at what later became 25 N. Main St and Annie worked as a cigar maker in her husband's business.
- Mary's husband Adam Shenberger died in 1898 and afterwards Mary lived with her parents in Red Lion. She worked as a cigar maker.

- Annie's husband George Gohn is also an original Red Lion resident from 1880, more information on his contributions to Red Lion will be listed under Jacob Gohn's family fact sheet.
- Benjamin and his wife moved to North York where he worked as a cigar maker.
