

Location of residence

According to city directories and the book titled *Red Lion: The First One Hundred Years*, Adam and his family lived at what is now 54 N Main St. The 1929 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map below shows the house numbered as 52-54 N Main St and directly beside the corner house of Dr. John Hyson. Deed transactions, the 1885 Road Docket and city directories also confirm this to be the 1880 home of Adam Gebhard.



Occupation and Civic Involvement in Red Lion

- According to the 1880 census and various early city directories, Adam worked as a cigar manufacturer. The book titled 1930 Red Lion PA Golden Jubilee Souvenir Book states Adam moved to what became 54 N Main St in 1879 and started his cigar factory at that time.
- Adam was on the building committee for the original St. John's Reformed Church in 1882, his son John was on building committees in 1905 and 1925 for the erection of a new St. John's Reformed Church and the addition for the Sunday school, respectively.
- Elizabeth and Sarah worked as cigar makers. They lived with their mother Dorothea until she passed away in 1912, and then they moved to what is now 125 E. Broadway. After Elizabeth died, Sarah moved in with her brother John at what is now 264 E Broadway
- John and his wife Sarah lived at what is now 264 E. Broadway starting in 1884 (per the book titled 1930 Red Lion PA Golden Jubilee Souvenir Book)
- John first worked as a cigar maker and then by 1900 he opened what became known as Gebhard & McKee in 1908, a men's furnishings store that was located at what is now 119 E Broadway
- John served on the Board of Directors for the Red Lion Cemetery Association and was President of the town council in 1901 and 1902.
