
- 1. Henry Paules Born September 30, 1829 and died November 19, 1885

Samuel Paules Born March 4, 1859 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died February 18, 1932 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Canadochly Church Cemetery in Lower Windsor Twp, York County, PA. He married Sarah Greenawalt who was born January 20, 1865 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died December 1, 1931 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Canadochly Church Cemetery in Lower Windsor Twp, York County, PA
- **4.** Catherine Paules Born September 26, 1863 in York County, PA (per Canadochly church records)
- 5. Mary Ellen Paules Born June 10, 1865 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died July 25, 1934 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Prospect Hill Cemetery in Manchester Twp, York County, PA. She first married Valentine Parr who was born March 20, 1851 in York County, PA (per St. David's church records), died October 20, 1922 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Prospect Hill Cemetery in Manchester Twp, York County, PA. She then married Peter Wagner who was born August 2, 1870 in Adams County, PA (per death certificate), died December 21, 1944 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Greenmount Cemetery in York, York County, PA.

### Location of residence

• The order of households listed in the 1880 census and deed records suggest the Paules's lived at what became 84 N. Main St. For the most part, the census taker has listed families along the first block of N. Main St. in order from the square heading north. After the home of Jacob Miller

was visited at 62 N. Main St. on the south side of the railroad tracks, the next 6 households visited in order were those of (1) George Dietz, (2) William Algier, (3) Henry Paules, (4) Daniel Weaver, (5) Noah Olp and (6) Catherine Meyers.

We know that Catherine Meyer lived on the northwest corner of N. Main St. and W. High St. That would indicate the other five households would likely be located between the railroad tracks on N. Main St. and Catherine Meyer's house. Below is the 1908 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map that shows the buildings located on the west side of N. Main St. between the railroad tracks and the intersection with Main and High St.



The dwelling at the corner of W. High St. and N. Main St. was not in existence in 1880, therefore leaving the buildings at 128, 130, 134, 138 and 142 and possible residences for the five households previously mentioned. Deed transactions (Deed book 6-Q-208) verify that Henry Paules, the third household visited in this section, purchased what is listed as 134 N Main St. (later re-numbered 84 N Main St.) from Catherine Meyer in 1881 (this being the 3<sup>rd</sup> residence north of the railroad tracks). Coincidentally, Henry Paules's household was the 3<sup>rd</sup> household

visited after Jacob Miller's household and the property at 84 N. Main St. is also the 3<sup>rd</sup> dwelling north of the railroad tracks.

This residence is no longer in existence and has been torn down, it is now a parking lot along N. Main St.

# **Occupation and Civic Involvement in Red Lion**

• Henry is listed as a laborer in the 1880 census and Samuel, Catherine and Mary Ellen are listed as cigar makers.

## **Miscellaneous Notes**

- It appears the family moved out of Red Lion in 1886 shortly after Henry passed away.
- Samuel and Mary Ellen lived their adult lives in York City.
