### Individual Information

1. **Barton Jacobs** – Born August 14, 1845 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died February 22, 1917 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Greenmount Cemetery in York, York County, PA.
2. **Maggie Smith** – Born about 1855 in PA (per 1880 census)
3. **Gertie Jacobs** – Born about 1874 in York County, PA (per 1880 census) and died March 1880 in York County, PA (per 1880 census mortality schedule)
4. **Joseph W Jacobs** – Born December 8, 1871 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died April 12, 1917 in Lancaster County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Terre Hill Cemetery in Lancaster County, PA. He married **Lottie Weaver** who was born January 1, 1877 in Lancaster County, PA (per tombstone), died August 28, 1943 (per tombstone) and buried at Terre Hill Cemetery in Lancaster County, PA.
5. **Annie Jacobs** – Born about 1875 in York County, PA (per 1880 census)
6. **Sadie Jacobs** – Born about 1878 in York County, PA (per 1880 census) and died December 1879 in York County, Pa (per 1880 census mortality schedule)

### Location of residence

- Exact location unknown at this time. The next household visited by the census taker was Seth Minnich's household, and it is known that Seth Minnich lived at what is now 162 N. Main St. Also, strong circumstantial evidence suggests that the Jacob Gohn household, which was the household visited right before Barton Jacob's household, was also located along N. Main St. Jacob Gohn purchased property in 1883 from Edwin Moul along with the west side of N. Main St., between Catherine Meyer's home to the south and Edwin Moul and Seth Minnich to the north. This makes it plausible that Barton Jacobs and his family lived in a home that was owned by Edwin Moul in 1880 along N. Main St.

### **Occupation and Civic Involvement in Red Lion**

- Barton is listed as a laborer in the 1880 census and a cigar maker in the 1881, 1883, 1886 and 1887 city directories in Red Lion

### **Miscellaneous Notes**

- By 1890, Barton had moved his family to York where he would remain for the remainder of his life. Barton and his wife Maggie divorced in 1892. She moved to Baltimore, MD where she operated a hotel.
- No further information could be found on Annie Jacobs.
- Joseph eventually moved to Lancaster by 1899 according to city directories
