
Individual Information

1. **Jacob Young** – Born September 2, 1830 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died December 18, 1887 in York County, PA (per tombstone) and buried at Saint John’s Blymire UCC Cemetery in York Twp, York County, PA.
2. **Lucy Ann Marks** – Born June 30, 1830 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died September 14, 1901 in York County, PA (per tombstone) and buried at Saint John’s Blymire UCC Cemetery in York Twp, York County, PA.
3. **Emaline Young** – Born September 23, 1856 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died August 3, 1929 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Saint John’s Blymire UCC Cemetery in York Twp, York County, PA. She married **John Raver** who was born August 8, 1856 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died October 17, 1933 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Saint John’s Blymire UCC Cemetery in York Twp, York County, PA.
4. **John Young** – Born April 23, 1863 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died September 28, 1948 in Westmoreland County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Union Cemetery in Westmoreland County, PA. He married **Ida Danner** who was born March 1862 in Sandusky, OH (per death certificate), died December 22, 1930 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Union Cemetery in Westmoreland County, PA.

5. **Lucinda Young** – Born June 6, 1865 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died November 17, 1942 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Mount Zion Cemetery in Springettsbury Twp, York County, PA. She married **Augustus Emig** who was born August 18, 1863 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died November 23, 1934 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Mount Zion Cemetery in Springettsbury Twp, York County, PA.
6. **Henrietta Young** – Born February 10, 1866 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died August 14, 1943 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Greenmount Cemetery in York, York County, PA. She married **Valentine Emig** who was born July 4, 1869 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died October 16, 1941 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Greenmount Cemetery in York, York County, PA
7. **Noah Young** – Born May 29, 1868 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died December 12, 1937 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA. He first married **Margaret Kohler** who was born February 2, 1873 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died June 18, 1902 in York County, PA (per tombstone) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA. He then married **Fanny Elizabeth Klinestever** who was born August 4, 1875 in Lancaster County, PA (per death certificate), died May 31, 1956 in Lancaster County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Red Lion Cemetery in Red Lion, York County, PA.
8. **Adam Young** – Born March 8, 1870 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died February 6, 1961 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Zion United Methodist Church in Windsor Twp, York County, PA. He married **Lillie Stabley** who was born February 5, 1875 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died May 11, 1951 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Zion United Methodist Church in Windsor Twp, York County, PA.
9. **Agnes Young** – Born either June 2, 1869 in York County, PA (per death certificate) or June 2, 1871 (per tombstone), died January 7, 1946 in Lancaster County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Saint John's Blymire UCC Cemetery in York Twp, York County, PA.
10. **Lillie Young** – Born January 27, 1875 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died August 14, 1914 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Saint John's Blymire UCC Cemetery in York Twp, York County, PA.
11. **Charles Young** – Born April 30, 1878 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died July 1, 1962 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Zion United Methodist Church in Windsor Twp, York County, PA. He married **Frances Meads** who was born June 12, 1872 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died January 11, 1958 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Zion United Methodist Church in Windsor Twp, York County, PA.

Location of residence

- Below is a picture taken from the book titled *Red Lion: The First One Hundred Years*, that shows the Red Lion borough limits in 1880, the current borough limits and the name of the land owners as of March 10, 1884 who wanted to secede from Red Lion. This shows Jacob Young owning land north of W. Broadway and east of N. Mill St. This corresponds with property records that show in 1888 his estate sold property that he owned that was bordered by F. Messersmith (to the east), William Taylor (to the west), Daniel Ness (to the north), Frederick Heiselman (probably meant Heisler, as Frederick Heisler owned property to the southwest) and Andrew Keener (to the northwest). Also, the census taker visited Daniel Ness right before he visited Jacob Young, and then he next visited William Taylor, indicating it is very likely that Jacob Young was indeed neighbors of both Daniel Ness and William Taylor in 1880.



Occupation and Civic Involvement in Red Lion

- Jacob is listed as a farmer in the 1880 and also in the 1886 city directory.
- Jacob was elected as one of Red Lion's first councilmen in 1880
- Noah worked as a cigar maker and he originally lived and had his cigar factory along the north side of East Ave, near S. Main St. He then moved to what is now 29 S. Franklin St.
- Adam was the sole owner and proprietor of A. A. Young & Company, a cigar manufacturing company. Prior to entering the cigar manufacturing business, he worked for Horace Welty as a carpenter and was engaged in the leaf tobacco business with J. W. Blouse and J. S. Streavig under the name Red Lion Tobacco Company. Later on, he opened a cigar business with his son and E. P. Welty that was named Welty-Young & Co. Adam resided at what is now 107 S. Main St.
- Charles worked as a cigar maker and resided at what is now 23 Linden Avenue

Miscellaneous Notes

- Emaline, John, Lucinda, Henrietta, Agnes and Lillie all moved out of Red Lion by 1900 and didn't reside in the borough ever again.
