### Individual Information

1. **William Paules** – Born June 22, 1845 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died April 7, 1915 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Mount Rose Cemetery in Spring Garden Twp, York County, PA.
2. **Mary Hildebrand** – Born December 9, 1834 in York County, PA (per tombstone), died June 6, 1891 in York County, PA (per tombstone) and buried at Home Cemetery in Dallastown, York County, PA.
3. **Frank Paules** – Born March 29, 1865 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died June 1, 1937 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at New Fairview Church Cemetery in York County, PA. He married **Sarah Elizabeth “Bessie” McCandless** who was born October 11, 1872 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died February 4, 1950 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at New Fairview Church Cemetery in York County, PA
4. **Reuben Paules** – Born December 16, 1869 in York County, PA (per death certificate), died July 12, 1921 in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Greenmount Cemetery in York, York County, PA.
5. **Emma Paules** – Born about 1869 (per death certificate), June 1871 (per 1900 census) or 1872 (per 1880 census) in York County, PA, died November 25, 1925 (per death certificate) in York County, PA (per death certificate) and buried at Greenmount Cemetery in York, York County, PA.

### Location of residence

- Beach Nichols 1876 Atlas of York County does not indicate where William Paules lived. However, the census taker was working his way east along Country Club Road. He previously visited J. Poad and Chas. Neff and the next home visited after William Paules was that of H. Wagman to the southeast. The homes of B. Paulis and J. Smith to the south of Chas. Neff are outside of the limits of Red Lion borough in 1880. It seems likely that the home highlighted in yellow (next to the school) with no owner listed was the home of William Paules in 1880.



### Occupation and Civic Involvement in Red Lion

- William is listed as a Laborer on the 1880 census
- In 1884, William was elected to serve a three year on the Red Lion borough Council.

### Miscellaneous Notes

- It does not appear William and his family lived in Red Lion long, as no further record exists of them living in town. Mary had passed away in 1891, and it appears William and the 3 children had moved to York City.
